Projected Itinerary (which may be subject to adjustment)

Sunday 9 October Flight from Heathrow to Sofia. Transfer to the hotel. Welcome with local drinks. Lecture in the hotel by a specialist archaeologist. Dinner. Overnight.

Monday 10 October Visits to the National History Museum and the Archaeological Museum. Lunch, then a walking tour, including the Roman remains of the Emperor Constantine's quarter (4th C. AD), the Rotunda of St. George (4th C. AD), Alexander Nevski Memorial Church (early 20th C.) and the Basilica of St. Sophia and its underground necropolis. Independent dinner. Overnight.

Tuesday 11 October Drive to Starosel to visit the Thracian Tombs and Temples (5th - 3rd C. BC). Wine-tasting and lunch in the local winery of Starosel. Drive to Plovdiv and visit the Archaeological museum and its collection of Thracian artefacts. Later we shall have a walking tour of the Old Town and see the beautiful Bulgarian Revival period houses from 19th C. and the Roman theatre. Independent dinner.

NB! If there is a musical performance in the Roman theatre, we can arrange tickets, usually the performances start about 9.00 pm. Overnight in Plovdiv.

Wednesday 12 October First a short walk by the remains of the Roman forum and a visit to Trakart gallery, with 4th C. Roman mosaics in this small private museum. Then drive to

Stara Zagora, one of the largest cities in the Thracian Lowlands. Visit the Neolithic dwellings museum and the Archaeological museum. Lunch. Afternoon drive to Kazanlak. Tour of the Valley of the Thracian Kings, visiting the replica of the tomb of Kazanluk, included in UNESCO Heritage List, the original Royal tombs of Kosmatka, Ostrusha and Shushmanets and the museum with some of the excavated golden treasures. On the way visit the Shipka church built to commemorate the fallen Russian and Bulgarian officers and soldiers during the Russo-Turkish War, 1877–78. Dinner. Overnight in Kazanlak area.

Thursday 13 October Drive to Veliko Turnovo. Visit Samovodene Street with the workshops of local craftsmen, followed by a short walk to the ruins of the Royal citadel. Independent lunch. Afternoon drive to Ruse, and en route explore the Roman ruins of Nicopolis ad Istrum. Visit to the Archaeological museum in Ruse and the remains of the Roman town of Sexaginta Prista. Independent dinner. Overnight in Ruse.

Friday 14 October Drive to the Thracian tomb of Sveshtari in the archaeological reserve of Sboryanovo. The reserve includes two large necropoli, sanctuaries, remains of a Thracian fortified town, many tombs and the holy place of Demir Baba Teke, sacred to Aliani Muslims. The main tomb of Sveshtari has rich stone decoration and drawings. Picnic lunch. Return to Ruse and stroll in the centre enjoying the beautiful architecture. Independent dinner. Overnight.

Saturday 15 October Depart to Sofia. En route we shall stop at Ivanovo Rock church, with 14th C. frescoes. We also call at the town of Lovech, visiting the covered bridge from 19th C. and the old quarter. Chance to have a look at the medieval fortress ruins above the modern city. Independent lunch. Continue to Sofia, farewell dinner and overnight.

Sunday 16 October Free time before your mid-day transfer to the airport.

Price conditions: At the time of booking we shall confirm and invoice at the **starting price** of **£1,500** per person. That price will be reviewed subject to number of participants booked at the time of due balance (8 weeks before departure) and if necessary, re-invoiced accordingly. E.g., if **7** people booked, the price will be reduced to **£1,300**, if **9** people book, the price will be at its **final lowest**, i.e. **£1,200** per person.
